

Korean Language Evening Class Syllabus



1. Description

This course is designed for students without any prior knowledge of the Korean language who wish to read, write, and converse in Korean. The goal of this course is to develop basic communication skills. Students will reach this goal by learning *Hangeul* (the Korean alphabet), practicing speaking, writing, listening, and reading, and acquiring abilities to compose and use language that applies to everyday topics and functions.

2. Objective

Students will be able to read and write *Hangeul*; understand basic vocabulary and expressions used in daily conversations; understand basic grammar structure; greet, introduce themselves, buy items, and order food; and talk about their daily life, time, date, and weather in Korean.

3. Materials

'I Love Korean 1' Student's Book & Workbook (Written by Language Education Institute of Seoul National University, SNU Press)

4. Class

Each session consists of 10 weeks, the total of 60 hours of classes. Students meet on Mondays and Thursdays, for three hours from 6:30 PM to 9:20 PM.

5. Requirement

Students are required to hand in daily assignment, take a quiz, and present a role-play after finishing each unit. They also have to take the final examination.

6. Evaluation Criteria

Students must attend at least 80% of the total class hours and receive an average score of at least 70% to complete a level. Grades are determined based on the scores of the final examination, class participation, and assignments. Tardiness and absences are strictly monitored. Being tardy four times or three hours of absences each result in a day of absence. 'Failure on Attendance (FA)' applies to students whose average score is 70% or above, and attendance rate is below 80% but 70% or above. In such cases, students may move on to the next level through the placement test. Students who receive 'Failure (F)' must re-register for the same level.

1. Description

This course is designed for students who have successfully completed *I Love Korean 1* (60hours) or are at an equivalent level. The goal of this course is to develop basic communication skills. Students will reach this goal by practicing speaking, writing, listening, and reading, and acquiring abilities to compose and use language that applies to everyday topics and functions.

2. Objective

Students will be able to understand basic vocabulary and expressions used in daily conversations; understand basic grammar structure; talk about their family members, hobbies, travel experiences, and student life in Korea; and get to know how to use facilities such as bank, post office, transportation, and hospital in Korean.

3. Materials

'I Love Korean 2' Student's Book & Workbook (Written by Language Education Institute of Seoul National University, SNU Press)

4. Class

Each session consists of 10 weeks, the total of 60 hours of classes. Students meet on Mondays and Thursdays, for three hours from 6:30 PM to 9:20 PM.

5. Requirement

Students are required to hand in daily assignment, take a quiz, and present a role-play after finishing each unit. They also have to take the final examination.

6. Evaluation Criteria

Students must attend at least 80% of the total class hours and receive an average score of at least 70% to complete a level. Grades are determined based on the scores of the final examination, class participation, and assignments. Tardiness and absences are strictly monitored. Being tardy four times or three hours of absences each result in a day of absence. 'Failure on Attendance (FA)' applies to students whose average score is 70% or above, and attendance rate is below 80% but 70% or above. In such cases, students may move on to the next level through the placement test. Students who receive 'Failure (F)' must re-register for the same level.

2. Objective

Students will be able to understand vocabulary and expressions used in daily conversations; understand grammar structure; and talk about their plans, inquiry, experiences, employment, health, gatherings, changes, and holidays in Korean.

3. Materials

'I Love Korean 3' Student's Book & Workbook (Written by Language Education Institute of Seoul National University, SNU Press)

4. Class

Each session consists of 10 weeks, the total of 60 hours of classes. Students meet on Mondays and Thursdays, for three hours from 6:30 PM to 9:20 PM.

5. Requirement

Students are required to hand in daily assignment, take a quiz, and present a role-play after finishing each unit. They also have to take the final examination.

6. Evaluation Criteria

Students must attend at least 80% of the total class hours and receive an average score of at least 70% to complete a level. Grades are determined based on the scores of the final examination, class participation, and assignments. Tardiness and absences are strictly monitored. Being tardy four times or three hours of absences each result in a day of absence. 'Failure on Attendance (FA)' applies to students whose average score is 70% or above, and attendance rate is below 80% but 70% or above. Students will be able to understand vocabulary and expressions used in daily conversations; understand grammar structure; and talk about their information, meeting, consumption, regret, work life, accident, visiting a sick person, anniversary, and dreams in Korean.

'I Love Korean 4' Student's Book & Workbook (Written by Language Education Institute of Seoul National University, SNU Press)

4. Class

Each session consists of 10 weeks, the total of 60 hours of classes. Students meet on Mondays and Thursdays, for three hours from 6:30 PM to 9:20 PM.

5. Requirement

Students are required to hand in daily assignment, take a quiz, and present a role-play after finishing each unit. They also have to take the final examination.

6. Evaluation Criteria

Students must attend at least 80% of the total class hours and receive an average score of at least 70% to complete a level. Students will be able to listen and react appropriately to what someone says; console someone who is in grief; offer invitations or express gratitude to others; express a variety of gestures; talk about memorable events; describe various types of weather; introduce recipes; make various reports and fill out applications; talk about personalities and attitudes; and recommend good performances or festivals in Korean.

3. Material

'I Love Korean 5' Student's Book & Workbook (Written by Language Education Institute of Seoul National University, SNU Press)

4. Class

Each session consists of 10 weeks, the total of 60 hours of classes. Students meet on Mondays and Thursdays, for three hours from 6:30 PM to 9:20 PM.

5. Requirement

Students are required to hand in daily assignment, take a quiz, and present a role-play after finishing each unit. They also have to take the final examination.

6. Evaluation Criteria

Students must attend at least 80% of the total class hours and receive an average score of at least 70% to complete a level. The goal of this course is to foster communication skills needed in various social settings and maintain network of acquaintances. Various topics such as jobs, society, and environment issues will be discussed to facilitate better understanding of Korean society and culture.

2. Objective

Students will be able to relay what they have seen or heard; politely raise an issue appropriate for the situation; courteously ask for someone's understanding; negotiate working conditions; explain and resolve misunderstandings; conduct a survey; express assertions and agreement about environmental protection; and describe cityscapes in Korean.

3. Material

'I Love Korean 6' Student's Book & Workbook (Written by Language Education Institute of Seoul National University, SNU Press)

4. Class

Each session consists of 10 weeks, the total of 60 hours of classes. Students meet on Mondays and Thursdays, for three hours from 6:30 PM to 9:20 PM.

5. Requirement

Students are required to hand in daily assignment, take a quiz after finishing each unit, and present a role-play for every three units. They have to conduct a survey and give a presentation based on their survey results. They also have to take the final examination.

6. Evaluation Criteria

Students must attend at least 80% of the total class hours and receive an average score of at least 70% to complete a level. Grades are determined based on the scores of the final examination, class participation, and assignments. Tardiness and absences are strictly monitored. Being tardy four times or three hours of absences each result in a day of absence. 'Failure on Attendance (FA)' applies to students whose average score is 70% or above, and attendance rate is below 80% but 70% or above. In such cases, students may move on to the next level through the placement test. Students who receive 'Failure (F)' must re-register for the same level.
